Diocesan Philosophy

The diocesan Religious Education Office is commissioned by the Bishop to support and promote lifelong catechesis for the diocese of Gary. The office aims to collaborate with the communities of the diocese, varied culture and background. It is within this diversity that the REO encourages the unfolding nature of the Catholic tradition and the shared calling to be witnesses to the fullest expression of God's love, Jesus Christ.

St. Matthias Religious Education Philosophy

We at St. Matthias abide in the Church's teaching handed down from the Apostles to the Founding Fathers. With a history rich in Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture we find the Truth manifested in apostolic secession, the Magisterium and guided by the Holy Spirit through the Holy See. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, of the Son and of the Holy Spirit." Matthew 28: 19-20. The words of Jesus the Christ ring through to all generations to all places, through the centuries and shall continue to the end of the age as Jesus proclaims, "I will be with you always even to the end of time."

Please note: The sacrament of Holy Eucharist is a two year program beginning with the reception of the sacrament of Penance in the second grade. Confirmation is also a two year program, beginning in the seventh grade with a class in morality. Confirmation will then be received in the eighth grade.

Criteria for the Authentic Presentation of the Christian Message

The Word of God contained in Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition is the single source of the fundamental criteria for the presentation of the Christian message.

- Centers on Jesus Christ
- Introduces the Trinitarian dimensions of the Gospel message
- Proclaims the Good News of salvation and liberation
- Comes from and leads to the Church
- Has a historical character
- Seeks enculturation and preserves the integrity and purity of the message
- Offers the comprehensive message of the Gospel and respects its inherent hierarchy of truths
- Communicates the profound dignity of the human person
- Fosters a common language of the Faith

Mass Attendance

The celebration of **Sunday** observes the moral commandment inscribed by nature in the human heart to render to God an outward, visible, public, and regular worship “as a sign of His universal beneficence to all.” Sunday worship fulfills the moral command of the Old Covenant, taking up its rhythm and spirit in the weekly celebration of the Creator and redeemer of His people. #2176 Catechism of the Catholic Church

The **Sunday** celebration of the Lord’s Day and His Eucharist is at the **heart** of the Church’s life. “Sunday is the day on which the paschal mystery is celebrated in light of the apostolic tradition and is to be observed as the foremost holy day of obligation in the universal Church”. #2177 Catechism of the Catholic Church

The precepts of the Church specifies the law of the Lord more precisely: **On Sundays and holy days of obligation the faithful are bound to participate in the Mass**”. (# 2180- 2195 the Catechism of the Catholic Church)

Curriculum

The textbooks used at St. Matthias are from Ignatius Press. The Faith and Life Series is a complete program for the parish catechetical year. This program helps the children explore their faith, develop morally and grow in religious understanding and practice. Deeply rooted in Scripture, it’s solid catechetical method helps children learn the teachings of the Catholic Church and live their faith each year. The texts and guides are found to be in conformity with the Catechism of the Catholic Church by the U.S. Bishops’ Ad Hoc Committee to Oversee the Use of the Catechism, and of course approved by the Diocese of Gary.

Church Law, Prayers, Fee, Progress Reports

Church law states that it is necessary for a person to be Baptized before receiving the Sacraments so it is necessary for us to keep a record. If the student has not been baptized at St. Matthias please bring in their baptismal certificate as soon as possible.

Prayers are a most important and traditional part of the faith. Because religious education classes meet only once a week prayer memorization needs to be practiced outside of class.

Religious Education fee for registered members of the parish will be 65.00 dollars per student not to exceed 175.00 dollars per family.

Progress reports are an essential tool in evaluation the comprehension of each student and will be given out at the end of each semester.

Sacraments

First Reconciliation/Confession preparation will be in the second grade. Reception for this sacrament be on Monday, March 21, 2011 for *all* second grade students and will be during regular class time.

First Communion/Eucharist preparation will be in the third grade. The date for First Holy Communion/Eucharist is Sunday, May 1, 2011 at 2:00 p.m..

Confirmation preparation is a two year program and begins in seventh grade with a study of morality. In eighth grade the students make their final preparations to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. The date for this Sacrament is at the discretion of the Bishop.

Student Guidelines

Conduct and dress should be that of a Christian student. No running, loud talking or inappropriate behavior is acceptable. Midriff tops, tight or too short clothing, objectionable pictures or sayings on clothing will not be permitted. Proper language is expected at all times.

Students are to be respectful to the adults, each other, church property and always conduct themselves in an orderly manner.

Toys, computer games, or cell phones are not to be brought to classes.

Students will be expected to bring completed homework assignments and their textbooks to class as needed.

Attendance - Arrival/Departure

Attendance on a regular basis is most important for the spiritual growth of the student. Please instill in your child the importance of religious education. We ask that the religious education office be **notified** in the event of each absence. If excessive absences occur the advancement of the student to the next grade could be put in jeopardy.

Please be kind and be on time (5:00 pm), tardiness can be upsetting to the class, catechists, and student when interruptions occur.

Arrival/ departure continued:

Cancellation of Crown Point public school classes because of inclement weather will result in cancellation of religious education classes also. Should we have to cancel classes for any reason, every effort will be made to notify all families as soon as possible. If you are uncertain about class or outside the Crown Point school system, please call 662-4281 or check the church website, www.stmatthiasparish@sbcglobal.net.

If the public school has a half day session religious education classes will continue as scheduled.

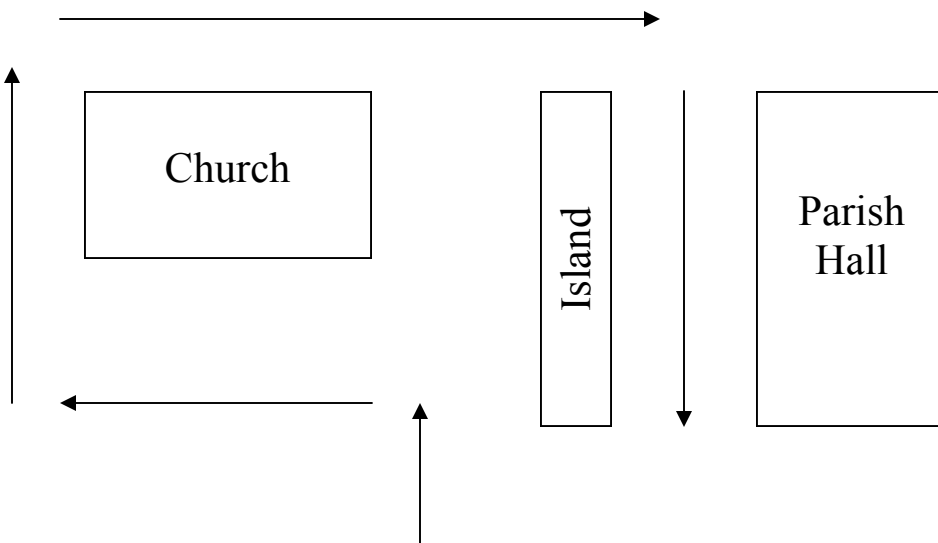
Arrival and departure from the hall will be under the canopy. **To drop off** students you may drive up facing south under the canopy. **To pick up** students we ask that you line up **facing north** with the car line circling the **Church**. This will ensure that the pick up line does not interfere with the construction project. (see diagram)

For their own safety, no student is to leave the hall until their name is called . Please place your child's name(s) on a card in your window when entering the pickup line. Car pooling will not be a problem. Just mention to the caller that more than one student is to be picked up.

For the safety of the children, please stay in line until the previous cars have moved.

Please be aware that we have classes in the Church, and children will be crossing the parking lot so that they can be dismissed from the hall. Use the utmost caution when driving through the pickup line. Everyone will be dismissed from the hall unless other arrangements are made.

If you wish to enter the building and pick up your child, please park in the lot so as not to interrupt the traffic flow as the children leave classes.

Precepts of the Church

Positive laws made by Church authorities to guarantee for the faithful the indispensable minimum in prayer and moral effort, for the sake of their growth in love of God and neighbor. (Catechism of the Catholic Church #2041-43)

You shall confess your sins at least once a year.

You shall receive the sacrament at least once during the Easter season.

You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.

You shall help to provide the needs of the Church.

The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each to his abilities.

The Church is ONE, HOLY, CATHOLIC, and APOSTOLIC.

About St. Matthias, Feast day, May 14

From the Acts of the Apostles we learn that Matthias has been one of the companions of our Savior from the day of His baptism by John.”

When there was a question of election of an apostle to take the place of Judas Iscariot who betrayed Jesus, Peter spoke: “Of these men who have been in our company all the time that the Lord Jesus moved among, from John’s baptism until the day that He was taken from us, of these one must be come a witness with us of His Resurrection.”

Two men were proposed: Barsabbas and Matthias, and the latter was chosen by lot. It was after this occurrence that the Holy Spirit descended upon the apostles , among whom Matthias was numbered.

Matthias preached the Gospel and stressed the value of self-denial. He continually called the people to do penance for their sins.

According to the Eastern Church, Matthias suffered martyrdom in Colchis, which is now called Ethiopia.

St. Matthias is sometimes called the thirteenth apostle. His shrine and remains are Trier, Germany
